Date: July 6-12, 2025 Location: Nashville, TN

The Nebraska Synod Journey is a week-long experience for youth who have completed grades 8-12 by the summer of 2025 and their adult leaders. The 2025 Journey to Nashville will feature service learning throughout the Nashville area, worship, fellowship, and other activities throughout the city. We will use our gifts as we grow in our faith together and learn about the gifts our neighbors in Tennessee bring to the table. Travel will be by Windstar motorcoaches, and housing will be in residence halls at Vanderbilt University, with an overnight stop each way in St. Louis. -The deposit is non-refundable and registration cost includes, transportation, meals and lodging



Thanks also for the many hands and hard work for God's Work, Our Hands Sunday. We tied two quilts, wrote thank you's and thinking of you cards, assembled 20 baby kits, removed steps and rock, planted plants, and deep cleaned the balcony. We appreciate everything and everyone!

Zach is in contact with a plumber for the kitchen improvements.

#### New Business:

The Property Committee will schedule a walk-through of the church and parsonage. We talked a bit about things needing to be done when the parsonage renter moves out, and cleaning of the utility shed at church.

We are looking at getting a speaker from Carol Joy Holling for a joint council meeting.

Mandy is looking into grants to purchase an AED for Concordia.

The Council also agreed that the noisy offering and World Hunger Banks could be combined to go to world hunger.

The Property Committee will research brighter lighting for the Sanctuary. This may be an Annual Meeting discussion in January.

Katie also handed out copies of the Shared Ministry Partnership Document, as a reminder of what and how we split the bills as a joint ministry.

Concordia won last year's coveted Food Challenge trophy. Beginning November 1 through December 1, food items will again be collected at both churches. Pastor will provide a list of food items needed for Thanksgiving and Christmas meals. Monetary gifts can also be given to cover these meals, which the Ministerial Association in Laurel provides.
