

Pastor's Article



"Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

A motion was made and seconded to amend the February Minutes to add Dana Village in Blair as the recipient of our Lenten offerings.

Judy Martindale was present for the Financial Secretary's Report. Peg Anderson was present for the Treasurer's Report, and led discussion on the insurance claim for clean-up at the Parsonage. We have presented a request to the Village of Concord for possible reimbursement via their insurance.
