



The monthly meeting of Concordia Lutheran Church Council was held March 3rd, 2025 at approximately 6:00 pm in the basement of First Lutheran Church of Allen. Present members were Peg Lutt, Grant Anderson, Kenny Steinle, Dustin Thompson, Zach Harder, and Pastor Deb Hammer.

We started the meeting with an Opening Prayer led by Pastor Deb Hammer.

Pastors Report was not shared as she just arrived back from her mission trip in Tanzania.

February 2025 Council Meeting Minutes presented by Secretary Grant Anderson were approved.

Judy Martindale, Financial Secretary, presented Concordia's monthly income for the month of February. After review, the financial reports were approved.

President, Peg Lutt presented a brief informational update of Concordia's Goals Plan/Progress.

Old Business:

Dustin purchased an AED kit for approximately \$1448.98. This purchase was made possible through funds from the Memorial Fund. Dustin recommended we purchase a LifeVac to go with the AED.

Brad and Zach Harder were able to locate and install LED sanctuary lights that are compatible with the current fixtures.

The tenants at the Church Parsonage officially moved in March 1, 2025. Kenny Steinle updated the council that everything went smooth. He presented the rent payments to Judy Martindale. Judy and Grant mentioned it may be easier to set up direct deposits for the tenants monthly rent payments as it would be easier to track down rent this way. Grant Anderson confirmed that the limits of liability were acceptable on their required insurance policies. Kenny presented the signed lease agreements of each tenant as well. The tenants did ask if we would allow cats. After discussion and concern for property damage, the council agreed to revisit their pet request six months down the road.

Concordia's Lutheran Church's 140-year anniversary is approaching in May. Peg encouraged the council to start brain storming ideas for the celebration. Due to scheduling we would most likely celebrate that on May 18th or June 8th.

Church Council will serve Lenten Lunch on March 19th.

New Business:

Peg read a 'Thank You' letter from the Synod Representative for Mission and Stewardship, Timothy Siburg, thanking Concordia for our continued contribution to Mission Share.

A donation to LCC Band was approved for \$200 for their upcoming trip to march in Chicago's Memorial Day Parade in May.

Peg updated the Council on upcoming Baptisms. The Krusemark Family will be having a baptism March 16th. The Stewart Family will be having a baptism March 30th

We will need to order Palms for Palm Sunday on April 13th.

There will be a Middle School gathering April 12 @ OSLC Wayne.

Organizing College Boxes will begin April 1 and they will be delivered in May.

This year marks 80 years of Mission work through Lutheran World Relief.
