Date: July 6-12, 2025 Location: Nashville, TN

The Nebraska Synod Journey is a week-long experience for youth who have completed grades 8-12 by the summer of 2025 and their adult leaders. The 2025 Journey to Nashville will feature service learning throughout the Nashville area, worship, fellowship, and other activities throughout the city. We will use our gifts as we grow in our faith together and learn about the gifts our neighbors in Tennessee bring to the table. Travel will be by Windstar motorcoaches, and housing will be in residence halls at Vanderbilt University, with an overnight stop each way in St. Louis. Each participating congregation is asked to register one adult leader for every six youth. Adult leaders must be at least 21 years of age.





Cultivating Love Through Community

"Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:5-7

Love is cultivated through love in community. A sense of community can be nurtured by taking small steps, starting a conversation with your neighbor, checking in on a new co-worker, or stopping by to say "hi" to a custodian or cashier. Building a sense of community starts with small, intentional acts of kindness and acknowledgment. Did you know.....

- Living in a community promotes our health and well-being.
- Our minds are relational and affected by the quality of our social connections.
- Community is built through acts of intentionality, vulnerability, and creativity.

The quality of our relationships often depends on how willing we are to be vulnerable with others and the degree to which we can respect others' vulnerabilities. Vulnerability refers to the feeling we experience during times of uncertainty. As we gather this Thanksgiving, let us remember the greatest gift of all - our fellowship in Christ. This Thanksgiving, I encourage you to take a moment to reflect on the goodness of God and the many ways in which he has blessed us. Judy Martindale was present for the Financial Secretary's Report. Trisha Reifenrath provided the Treasurer's Report. A motion was made and seconded to approve the September reports for Pastor, the Financials, Minutes, and the Treasurer's October payments, to include the following: \$1,132.81 to Brad Harder for shed materials and all his work throughout the year; \$100 donation to the Aubrey Mitchell benefit; and \$200 for Clergy Appreciation month for Pastor's Tanzania trip.
